About the Venue

Sanasar is a tourist hotspot located on the national highway 1A, 20 kilometers west of Patnitop, in the district Ramban, Jammu province, UT of J&K, India. While it is rich in alpine flora and fauna, it is aero-adventure-sports capital of Jammu division with facilities like paragliding, hot air ballooning, zip line ride and horse riding. Other attractions include Sanasar Lake, Tulip Garden and captivating beauty of natural valleys of wild flowers, alpine forest and unending series of hills. The average temperature may range between 10-20°C, as such, the participants are advised to carry warm clothes.

How to Reach Sanasar

The Jammu city is well connected with air, train or bus. One can reach Jammu through flight at Jammu airport.

By Rail: The nearest station is Udhampur. All the trains to Mata Vaishno Devi halt at Udhampur. Upon reaching Jammu one may travel through taxi/bus on their own. If you opt for transportation through organizers, you may contact them in advance. Those who want to bring their families and travel on their own may contact the organizers for accommodation. Shree Mata Vaishno Devi is about 55 km from the Jammu. Abstract

The abstract and paper may be submitted through email eesl2024esaind@gmail.com. The abstract may be typed on A-4 size paper in MS doc (font Times New Roman, size 12 point, and in single spacing, leaving one inch margin from left and right side of the page along with 3-5 keywords. The word limit for abstract would be 250- 300 words. The abstract must contain a clear title, name(s) and affiliation of author(s). The name of presenting author should be underlined and e-mail of corresponding author should be given at the end. Thematic area of work may be highlighted in **Bold.** There should not be any sub-headings, figure, table and references in the abstract. The paper must be submitted through email to eesl2024esaind@gmail.com.The participants may also submit full papers for consideration. The selected papers would be published in the book with ISBN number. The detailed specification for preparing the poster paper would be e-mailed to those authors whose poster has been selected for presentation.

Oral presentation (OP): Five minutes will be allocated to the presenter for oral presentation. The OP must be prepared using MS office power Point Presentation (PPT) in 2007 or in upper version which contains 15 maximum slides as limit.

Poster presentation (PP): Each delegate (author) can present maximum of their two posters in different broader themes allocated for the conference. The size of poster should be of **18** ×**24 inch** dimensions. A template of poster should be shared on email after the acceptance of abstract. The authors should prepare their work in provided template only.

Tourist places

 Patnitop: Located around 20 kilometers from Sanasar, Patnitop is a popular hill station known for its lush greenery, meadows, and panoramic views of the snow-capped peaks of the Himalayas. Visitors can indulge in activities like trekking, paragliding, and horse riding amidst the stunning surroundings.
Nathatop: Situated at an altitude of 2,700 meters, Nathatop offers breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains and valleys. It is famous for its snow-covered slopes during the winter months, making it a favored destination for skiing and snowboarding enthusiasts.

3. **Sudh Maha Dev and Mantalai**: Approximately 60 kilometers from Sanasar. As tourist spots, Sudh Maha Dev and Mantalai would be conceptualized as sites or attractions that celebrate their significance within Hindu mythology and culture.

Mantalai, being associated with celestial realms and divine chariots, could inspire a different kind of tourist attraction. This could take the form of a celestial observatory or stargazing center, offering visitors the opportunity to explore the wonders of the night sky. The center could include planetarium shows, telescope viewing sessions, and educational exhibits on astronomy and Hindu cosmology.

These attractions around Sansar Jammu offer a perfect blend of natural beauty, spirituality, and adventure, making it a must-visit destination for travelers seeking solace amidst nature's bounty.

4. **Mata Vaishno Devi Temple**: Approximately 122 kilometers from Sanasar, Mata Vaishno Devi, also known as Vaishnavi, is a revered Hindu goddess

worshipped primarily in the northern Indian state of Jammu and Kashmir situated atop the Trikuta Mountains, is one of the most sacred and popular pilgrimages in India.



5. **Shivkhori Cave Temple**: This sacred cave temple dedicated to Lord Shiva is located around 70 kilometers from Sanasar. It is renowned for its naturally formed stalagmites, which are worshipped as the 'Shivling'. The cave is accessible via a trek through picturesque landscapes, adding an element of adventure to the spiritual journey.

6. **Mansar Lake:** Approximately 50 kilometers from Sanasar, Mansar Lake is a picturesque water body surrounded by lush greenery and hills. The lake is considered sacred and is adorned with several temples and shrines along its banks. Boating facilities are available for visitors to explore the tranquil waters.
